LATE FEE NOTICE!

ALL PAYMENTS made AFTER February 1, 2023 will result in a LATE FEE of \$10 per week. Include this fee in your payment with each portion of a week considered a whole week.

Suspension - Members who do not pay their dues or late fees will have their license suspended. On March 1, members will be given notice that on April 3, a petition will be filed with the Supreme Court requesting that the members who have not paid their bar dues or late fees will have their license suspended immediately. (See Alaska Bar Rule 61.)

MANDATORY ARPC 1.15 Safekeeping Property IOLTA Account

Active Status Only - (e) A lawyer shall indicate on the lawyer's annual bar dues notice whether the lawyer or the lawyer's law firm: 1) elects to maintain the IOLTA trust account described in paragraph (d); 2) elects not to maintain the IOLTA trust account described in paragraph (d); or 3) does not maintain a trust account. A lawyer or law firm who wishes to change a previous election may do so at any time by notifying the Alaska Bar Association in writing. An IOLTA account may be maintained in or Outside of Alaska with client or third party consent.

Lawyers' Fund for Client Protection - \$10 fee included with dues

Active Status Only - This fund is created for the purpose of reimbursing clients who have suffered non-insured losses of money or things of value as a result of dishonest conduct by attorneys. Bar Association Bylaw Article III, Section 1 (a) mandates that all active members must pay \$10 annually to the Fund. Bar Rule 61 provides that a member may be suspended for failure to pay this fee.

Alaska Bar Foundation

The non-profit Alaska Bar Foundation raises and distributes funds to improve the administration of justice and provide legal services to the indigent. Change Membership Status - Requests to transfer status to inactive must be made by **January 1**. An affidavit must be completed and sent to the Alaska Bar Association office. You may obtain a form by contacting our office or one is available on the Alaska Bar website. A member who practices law for any portion of a year is not eligible to go on inactive status for that year. Submit your MCLE Compliance Report - Alaska Bar Rule 64 requires active Bar members to complete 3 credits in ethics CLE (MCLE) each year and encourages Bar members to complete at least 9 additional credits in general or ethics CLE (VCLE) each year.

- The rule also requires MCLE reporting by February 1 of each year for the preceding calendar year.
- Failure to comply with Rule 65 can result in fines and suspension from the Bar pursuant to AK Bar Rule 66.

Join a Substantive Law Section - Sections provide professional growth and development through: monthly meetings, CLE programs, an online newsletter, review of legislative and court actions.

Section meetings with substantive topics are approved for one CLE credit. Membership is open to all members in good standing; must renew each year; term is one calendar year; your first section is FREE; each additional section is \$15.
