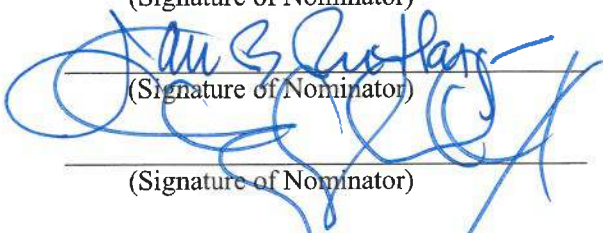

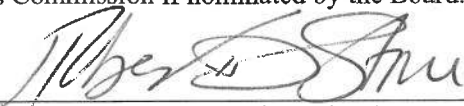

I then held a 2-year clerkship with Judge Singleton in the U.S. District Court, before entering private practice. During my first five years of practice, I primarily represented employers, insurance companies, and adjusting companies. For the past 24 years, I have maintained an active litigation practice exclusively representing injured plaintiffs.

I have continually strived to be active in the Alaska Bar Association since my admission 31 years ago. I have served on a various committees, including the Fee Arbitration Committee, the Board of Governors as the New Lawyer Liaison, the Lawyers Fund for Client Protection Committee, and the Discipline Committee.
