

Statement of background of William R. Satterberg, Jr.

I attended law school at Syracuse Law School and with the Notre Dame Law School London Studies Program, graduating in 1976. That same year, I was admitted to the Alaska Bar. I am now in my forty-ninth year of practice. I worked for four years for the State of Alaska Attorney General's Office in the Fairbanks Transportation section, and one year in Saipan as an Assistant Attorney General for the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands. Both government positions were as litigation counsel. In 1982, I entered the private sector and have had my own law firm since late 1982, after spending eleven months first with the Birch/Horton firm, also as litigation counsel. My law practice is based primarily in Fairbanks, but I accept cases statewide. I have handled a mixed variety of both civil and criminal cases with approximately ninety five percent of this firm's work involving trial practice. In addition to trial practice, I have argued numerous appeals before both the Alaska Supreme Court and the Alaska Court of Appeals. I am seventy-three years old. I have been married to my wife, Brenda, for forty-four years. We have two adopted children, Marianne and Kathryn, as well as two grandchildren, fifteen-year-old Jacob, and six-year-old Daisy.
